Progress Report of Media Monitoring of INEC's Twitter Handle, INEC's News online, Print & Online Newspapers' Reporting on INEC

(An analysis of trends in reportage of INEC's activities by 12 print/online newspapers in July and August, 2019)

1.0 INTRODUCTION

This report covers the outcome of the monitoring of twelve (12) print and online newspapers conducted in the months of July and August, 2019. The newspapers are *The Punch*, *The Guardian*, *Daily Sun*, *Vanguard*, *ThisDay*, *Nigerian Tribune*, *The Nation*, *Leadership*, *Daily Trust*, *Blue Print (online version)*, *The Cable* (published online only) and the **Premium Times** (published online only).

Other platforms monitored within the period include INECnews.com and INEC's twitter handle (https://twitter.com/inecnigeria).

The monitoring highlights the findings and analysis of trends in reportage of INEC's activities by the twelve print/online newspapers listed above. It also highlights INEC's engagement with the community of voters and the citizens in general as observed from the commission's social media and online platform.

The purpose is to provide evidence-backed information on state of media performance in the coverage of INEC's activities and the level of engagement the commission is facilitating with its community both in the mainstream media, online media, its website and on social media platform (that is, twitter).

The outcome is expected to be used as tools to engage with the commission on its activities and ways to deliver effectively on its mandate.

2.0 SPECIFIC ISSUES MONITORED ON INEC

The specific issues monitored on INEC, as a thematic focus, included reportage in terms of:

- ➤ Continuous Voters' Registration;
- ➤ Voter and Civic Education;
- ➤ Administrative Procedures
- Permanent Voters' Cards (PVCs)

3.0 FINDINGS

4.1 Total Relevant Reports on INEC (July-August, 2019)

A total of 98 editorial items were found relevant to the media content monitoring exercise in the 12 newspapers (that is, as falling under identified specific issues).

For the print monitoring, **BluePrint** published the highest number of relevant reports with 15 (at 15.3%) followed by **Daily Trust** and **The**

Nation each of which published 12 relevant reports (at 12.24%). Nigerian Tribune published 11 reports (11.2%); Daily Sun and The Guardian each published 10 reports (at 10.2%); Leadership published 8 (8.2%); The Punch published 6 reports (6.12%) and ThisDay published 3 (3.1%). Vanguard published the least with only one report (1%).

For the monitoring of online newspapers, **Premium Times** published 6 reports (6.1%) while **The Cable** published 4 (4.1%).

Findings show that there was nothing relevant published on the platform between July and August, 2019. Check on the website shows that the last engagement on the INEC's news platform was on 3rd of June, 2019.

However, there was a continuous display of timeline on the platform, showing the countdown to Kogi and Balyesa States' governorship elections slated for November, 2019.



FINDINGS: (July, 2019)

A total of 161 tweets were posted on INEC's twitter handle between July 1 and July 31, 2019. These posts generated a total of 1,439 retweets; 4,437 'likes' and 476 comments.





Findings: (August, 2019)

A total of 50 tweets were posted on INEC's twitter handle between August 1 and August 31, 2019. These posts generated 921 retweets; 2,691 constitute 'likes' while 287 tweets were comments.
